We conduct internal environmental reviews and publicise the results. The reviews measure our performance and ensure that we are meeting our policy goals as well as compliance requirements.

We seek to develop services, in conjunction with our Customers and suppliers, which promote environmental protection where there is a sound business rationale.

Much of this centres on buying into the environment by pursuing a purchasing policy geared to environmental considerations. All our suppliers are required to provide proof of their environmental credentials. We also work towards reducing our own environmental impact by training and promoting environmental awareness within our Company.

We encourage our suppliers to consider fully the environmental implications of their businesses and the impact on them of environmental issues. We share information with suppliers and Customers as appropriate.
